Artifacts from building bridge Blakely's past with its present

When renovations on the Alexander Building, located at 214 Court Square, began in November 2012, no one expected that a time capsule spanning five decades would be found.

When workers removed the floorboards from the building, they unearthed numerous medicine bottles, turn of the century coins, and various other historical artifacts important in preserving the historical significance of the Alexander Building.

Some of the items have been dated while others remain a mystery. Those dated include a 1900 Liberty V nickel, a 1903 Indian Head Cent, a (c. 1915) antiseptic

bottle, a (c. 1925) Nehi soda bottle, and a (c. 1946) aspirin bottle with the tablets and cotton still inside.

One of the more unique items, a bone fragment, was sent to the University of Georgia whereby an anthropologist dated it to the early 1900s. It was concluded to have been from the modern day rump roast portion of a cow, however the bone was cut in a way that pre-dated USDA regulations and was likely part of a small steak.

All artifacts that were found are available for viewing at the Chamber of Commerce located at 182 Court Square.

Did you know...

Many different flags have flown over Blakely. Among them: Spain, France, England, The Confederate States of America, and the United States.
